EPA Unveils Controversial Renewable Fuel Proposal

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has announced its long-awaited proposed volume requirements under the [Renewable Fuel Standard](#) (RFS) program for the years 2014, 2015 and 2016, as well as proposed volume requirements for biomass-based diesel for 2017. However, reactions from the biofuels sector and industry supporters have been mixed, with one disappointed U.S. senator saying, "It's Christmas in May for Big Oil."

Schools Turn to Propane Buses as Stricter Emissions Standards Loom





MACON, Ga. - For many Americans, propane is that stuff from the home improvement store that fuels backyard barbecues and patio dinners. But in a growing number of cities across the country, it is what gets children to school. Of the top 25 school bus markets, 19 have propane-fueled vehicles in their fleets, including New York, Chicago, Houston, Los Angeles, Miami, Philadelphia and Phoenix. Boston just bought 86 of the alternative-fuel buses for the fall, while in the Mesa County Valley district in Grand Junction, Colo., administrators recently signed a five-year, \$30 million contract that includes 122 propane buses.
