Electric Buses in Downtown Louisville

Transit Authority of River City (TARC) celebrated their 40th anniversary on November 10 at Union Station in downtown Louisville. The commemoration included the unveiling of one of ten all-electric zero emission buses coming to Louisville. The addition of the new Proterra ZeroBuses will replace outdated high polluting trolley vehicles that circulate free of charge through downtown



routes.



M & M Cartage and Kentuckiana Cleanfuel Open CNG Fueling Station

M & M Cartage and Kentuckiana Cleanfuel (KCF), both of Louisville, partnered to install a new Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) fueling station in Louisville, Kentucky at 6200 Geil Lane. Family and friends gathered at the site November 19 for a celebratory soft opening. The site off Interstate 65 is the first KCF station and one of several CNG fueling locations Kentuckiana Cleanfuel and M & M Cartage plan to open in the region. The station will fuel M & M Cartage's natural gas semi truck fleet, as well as other commercial fleets, and the general public.
